Open Lectures: Course Requirements

Course requirements for Open Lectures **are the same** for Linguistics and Literature and Culture on the BA and MA levels.

During your studies, we encourage you to attend open lectures organized by the Institute of English Studies, the University of Warsaw, or other academic and cultural institutions (e.g., museums, science centers, libraries, etc.). Please note that talks organized for Noc Anglistów Festival <u>are not</u> classified as open lectures. For every lecture, you receive 1 point. You are required to collect between 8 to 12 points, and your grade will depend on the number of points:

8 points – 3 (dostateczny)

9 points – 3+ (dostateczny plus)

10 points – 4 (dobry)

11 points – 4+ (dobry plus)

12 points – 5 (bardzo dobry).

You document your attendance in an Open Lectures table found here: https://ia.uw.edu.pl/fileadmin/ilustracje/dokumenty/2022/Lectures list general.pdf

In the table, you enter the date and the title of the lecture.

For in-person lectures: in the box "Proof of attendance," obtain the signature or stamp of one of the organizers/professors from the IA or UW who are present.

For online lectures: in the box "Proof of attendance," write "online."

For every lecture, please write a short summary (200-250 words) stating the main topic or thesis. The summary needs to be in English. Arrange all your summaries in one text file.

Once you have collected all the points, print the file with all the summaries and attach the Open Lectures table at the front. Submit the printed documents into the OPEN LECTURES file and email your Open Lectures Course coordinator that you are ready to pass the course.
